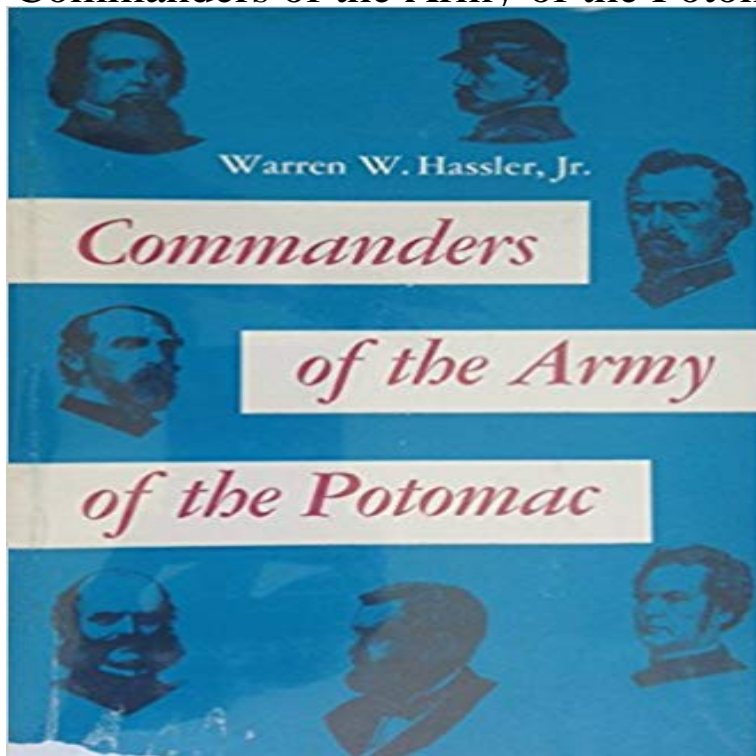


Commanders of the Army of the Potomac
