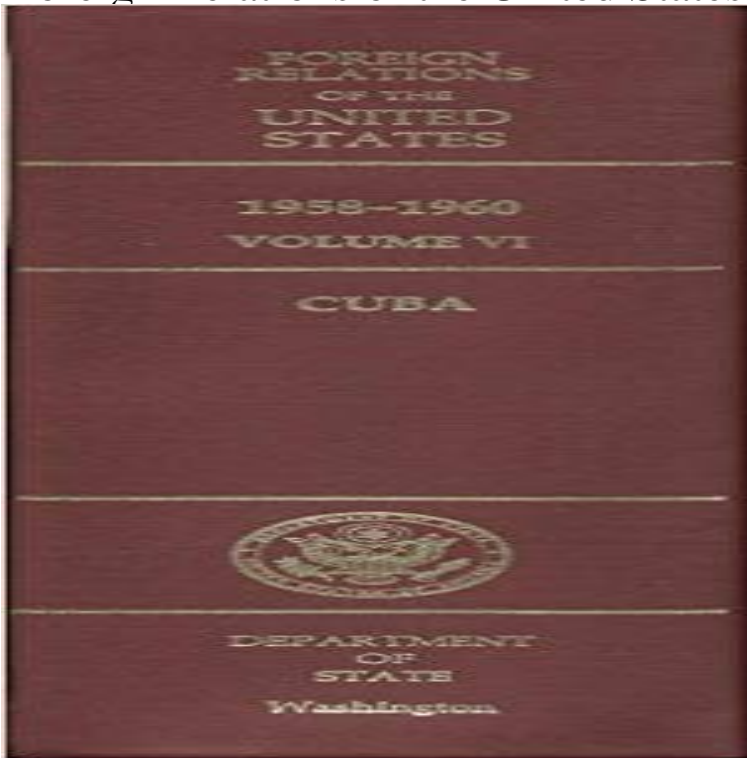


Foreign Relations of the United States, 1958-1960, Volume VI: Cuba
