
Helping your child get ready for school: With activities for children from birth through age 5 (Volume 4)



Helping Your Child Get Ready for School - Activities for Children from Birth through to Age 5 Teaching and learning are not mysteries that can only happen in school. They also happen when parents and children do simple things together.For instance, you and your child can: sort the socks on laundry day--sorting is a major function in math and science; cook a meal together--cooking involves not only math and science but good health as well; tell and read each other stories--storytelling is the basis for reading and writing (and a story about the past is also history); or play a game of hopscotch together--playing physical games will help your child learn to count and start on a road to lifelong fitness.By doing things together, you will show that learning is fun and important. You will be encouraging your child to study, learn, and stay in school.
