And he tells how even today Morgan's influence is felt among environmentalists, anarchists, feminists, and other social visionaries. Morgan explained how humans evolved beyond nature to both the splendor and squalor of the Industrial Age and offered an unprecedented analysis of the interplay between family, property relations, the state, and the human mind.
